## A new old Workshop at Amarna? Mr. Hayter's Notebook in the Archive of the Egypt Exploration Society

In 1921, a team excavated some houses in the Main City South at Amarna. The work was directed by Thomas Eric Peet (1882–1934) and carried out on behalf of the Egypt Exploration Society. It is due to the meticulously kept site notebook of Angelo George Kirby Hayter (1863–1927) that minute details could be restored in the archaeological record of the House of Ranefer. The resulting publication, *The City of Akhenaten I* (Peet and Woolley 1923), mentions that the street adjacent to the House of Ranefer yielded many objects related to glass and glaze making, although not associated with a specific architectural structure.

In 2023, Mr. Hayter's notebook was re-examined in the archive of the Egypt Exploration Society, revealing valuable information regarding this particular area and its layout. This lecture will shed light on the 1921 excavation at Amarna, the people involved and their legacy. It will attempt to contextualise the newly re-discovered workshop area in Amarna's Main City South before outlining future plans concerning the re-excavation of this unpublished, little-known site.
